
This training covers all aspects of NHS guidance on vaccine administration and clinical governance. It meets NHS training criteria and incorporates the National NHS PGD.

Step 2: Face-to-Face Learning Workshop (1-4 hours)

This part only applies if you have purchased the face-to-face workshop based course. The face-to-face workshop will focus on the practical aspects of the training. This will run as follows:

- Basic Life Support & CPR Practical CPR learning using clinical CPR dummies
- Questions and answer session

Part 3: Online Assessment

Workshop based course: If you have purchased the workshop you will be given the assessment access codes at the workshop. You will be able to access the assessment section immediately after the workshop ends.

Online learning course: If you have purchased this course as an online refresher course then you can access the assessment section immediately after you finish the online learning. An assessment access password will be provided to you with your confirmation email.

The online assessment must be completed before you can access your certificate of course completion.

Please note: access to the online learning portal and course assessment is restricted to 28 days. You must complete the assessment in 28 days after purchase or 28 days after attendance at the workshop.

Certificate of course completion

You will be able to download your certificate of course completion after undertaking an online assessment. This certificate can be used towards your declaration of competence.





Frequency of training

The NHS Flu PGD requires all healthcare professionals to undertake face-to-face training every 3 years.

The Health Protection Agency recommends that healthcare professionals undertake annual training.

Our 'Online Refresher' training course is available for health care professionals who don't need the practical training but require a refresher.
